






Module Development Workshop

LC members and Dr. Rosnafisah Sulaiman, Business Development Department Director, were invited to join "Information Sharing and Briefing Session on Open and Distance Learning (ODL)" on 14th February 2020 at Campus Sultan Haji Ahmad Shah in Muadzam Shah.

In the session that was organized by College of Business Management and Accounting (COBA), Prof. Dato' Dr. Ansary



Ahmed (Founder and President of Asia e University) and Prof. Ahmed Hashem (Vice President of OUM (Business Development and Technology) have shared their knowledge and experiences in both e-learning and ODL arena.

In his presentation, Prof. Dato' Dr. Ansary stressed on the importance of seeing how technology changes in education with Education 4.0 by 2030. Among the key changes include flexible delivery, personalized learning and students being evaluated and not examined. He also explained on E-Learning Framework, Technology Design, Content Design and Learning Design that provides a strong foundation for ODL effectiveness.







What is Open and Distance Learning (ODL)?

- Open and Distance Learning (ODL) is a general term for the use of telecommunication to provide or enhance learning.
- It is a way of learning remotely without being in regular face-to-face contact with instructor in the classroom.
- "Open" in terms of being accessible by anyone and from anywhere.

Flipped Classroom and Active Learning

A Sharing Session







r. Jehana Ermy from TLC was invited by COBA on 14th February 2020 to share her experiences in managing flipped classroom and implementing active learning in her courses with their BL agents.

She started by introducing the BOLD 2025 Blended Learning (BL) Initiative and the four BL levels before focusing on BL Level 3 which is flipped teaching and learning. From her experience teaching EECB423 Data Communication and Network, she detailed the challenges of handling her students as well as how to get the students to participate willingly in the class activities. Next, she described the steps taken to implement a flipped classroom for a more engaging and meaningful learning.

She uses the "bookend" approach to help organize her materials and contents in Padlet and Moodle, as well as designing the assessment that would demonstrate the students' course outcome (CO). Finally, she shared some tips to quickly flip a lesson and how to gather evidence of the learning outcomes.

A Global Platform for AL/PBL Practitioners



The workshop covered topics on fun in career life, quality questions and active listening skills, micro goals versus superior goals, staff quality matrix measurement and breathing techniques.












Effective Implementation of Student-Centred Learning: Part 2
