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

This course was aimed to give a hands-on guide to conduct Moodle quizzes. It started with introduction to question types on Moodle quizzes including calculated, moving text, matching, multiple choice, short answer, true or false, numerical and many more.

The participants were mainly exposed to random quiz setting. The participants engaged wiith randomized questions, and setting random numbers into the questions. Later, topics involving standard symbols and mathematical symbols were introduced.

The course continued with grading analysis by retrieving students' grades and their responses.

Asia-Europe Meeting (ASEM) MOOC Stakeholder's Forum 2019 @ Putrajaya



The Asia-Europe Meeting (ASEM) MOOC Stakeholders' Forum 2019 was held on the 7th of November 2019 at Zenith Hotel, Putrajaya. It was hosted by the Universiti Malaysia Pahang (UMP), supported by the Department of Higher Education, MOE Malaysia. The main goal of this forum is to share best practices on

the operation and utilisation of MOOCs and to discuss the operational directions of the initiative.

Among the ASEM MOOC Network collaborators this year include Thailand, Japan, Phillipines, Korea and Malaysia. A total of seven presenters shared MOOC practices at their own institutions and in their own countries, paving the way for the adoption of MOOC model structure, policies and plans for implementation followed by forum sessions.

Among the key take-aways from the forum are the forecast of future work skills and the need to develop future-proof skills set. MOOCs will enable flexible learning at UNITEN through a fluid curriculum that allows sharing across fields and institutions. Plans to develop MOOC courses are in the pipeline.

Two representatives from UNITEN who attended the forum were Dr. Thaharah Hilaluddin and Mr. TJ Iskandar Abdul Aziz from TLC.
